Techfest will showcase some of the country's most innovative technology initiatives, galvanize the community, and empower people. We'll bring together various local technology communities and help organizations learn how to benefit from locally available skills, services, and products. Expect engaging presentations, trade-show talks, group activities, panel discussions, hands on demonstrations, and themes ranging from agriculture to robotics.

Track 1: Business, Art, and Entertainment






Track 3: Government, Journalism, and Security

Orange Expo




